## Your Binder and You

Your binder covers what your character knows from the first week of school, ending on Thursday. It includes your character's personal history along with information about their friendships, conflicts, and more.



## Shared vs Secret Information

Not everyone has the same information, and even shared events may look different depending on who is describing them. Your binder reflects your character's point of view, not the full story. Unless your binder specifically says another character knows something, your secrets are your own.

## When the School Week Ends

On Friday night, you will receive your first clue, which will update you on what happened after the binder ends and give you new party conversation topics, drama, or questions to bring with you on Saturday.



## Upcoming Murder

The murder will happen during the party, and the killer already knows who they are. If you are the victim, you will find out when it is time for you to die.

### Optional Characters

Upon arrival at the party, any guests who have not been assigned a character will be given a menu of Optional Characters to choose from. As a result, these characters may or may not attend. If they do, they may be people your character already knows. Any optional character in your binder is marked with an asterisk (\*). You will also receive a quick-reference sheet introducing any optional characters who are attending.
